The above man was passed as fit for Garrison Service Abroad on the 22nd September, 1916, by the Mill Hill Medical Board.

At the hearing of the appeal on the 5th December the following Doctor's certificates were produced by the man.

Certificate dated 16th Oct. 1916, of Drs. McFarlane and Mathewson to the following effect:-

"I have known Wm.R.F.Hewitt from his birth. He is a seven months child and has always been delicate and is now suffering from a double rupture and a hammer toe and varicose veins"

He also produced a certificate from Dr. Frank Oldfield of 3 Paper Buildings, Temple, of the 5th December as follows:-

" I hereby certify that I have to-day examined William Rowland Frank Hewitt age 31 and found him to be suffering from double inguinal hernia (controlled by truss) Vari-cose Veins - and hammer toe, left foot. He has Pyorrhea alocolari and rheumatism-it is not a good life for insurance - weak and below par.

The Middlesex Appeal Tribunal feel that in view of the above two certificates this man cannot be regarded as fit for Foreign Service (B.I.) and they, therefore, desire that he should be re-examined by the Medical Board.


